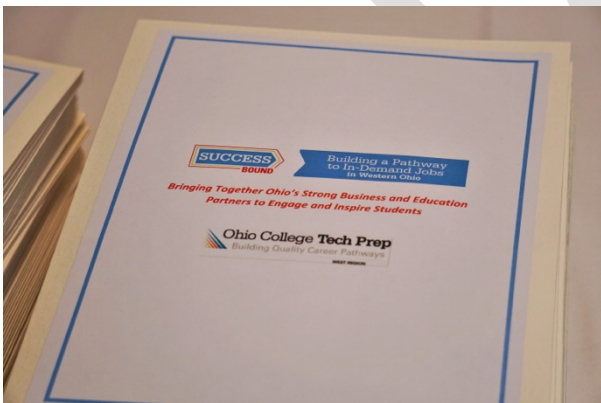
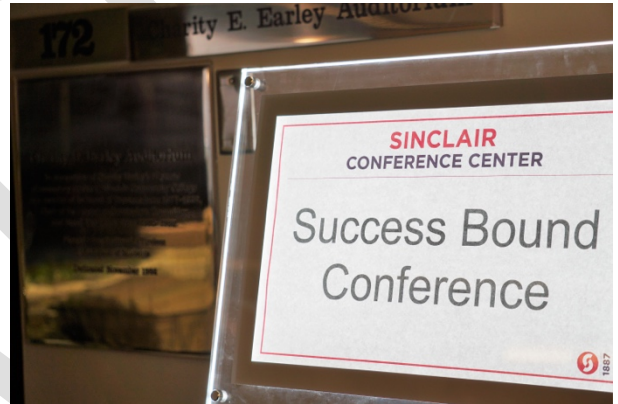




Ohio College Tech Prep West Regional Center Success Bound 2.0





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Conference Description

With direction from the Ohio Governor’s Office of Workforce Transformation, the New Skills for Youth Grant, Ohio Department of Education and the Ohio Department of Higher Education, the Ohio College Tech Prep West Regional Center hosted the 2019 SuccessBound 2.0 Conference at Sinclair Community College on Wednesday, March 6.

SuccessBound 2.0 Conference is aimed at closing the awareness gap of in-demand industries in our region for individuals who influence our students’ career decisions. We hope to forge relationships with in-demand businesses and schools and those individuals who influence students, to build future work-based learning opportunities.

Activities -

Over 150 participants from area high schools, career centers, businesses, non-profits, Educational Service Centers, colleges, home schools and churches toured a facility of their choice from the following regional in-demand industries:

- Aida -Advanced Manufacturing
- Community Tissue – Biomedical Health
- DMAX – Automotive/Manufacturing
- Managed Technologies - Information Technology
- PSA Airlines - Aviation/Aerospace

Following their tour, participants assembled at Sinclair Community College for the opportunity to collaboratively share their experiences and identify themes and emerging needs. *See attached Debriefing Session Answers*

Afternoon activities included powerful panel discussions showcasing existing work-based learning success stories followed with a pre-apprenticeship panel describing what pre-apprenticeships are and how they are conducted in order to build quality relationships for sustained impact. Outcomes -

One-third of the participants responded to a follow-up survey indicating that **100%** of those responding viewed their their **Overall Conference Experience** as either Very Satisfactory (52.08%) or Satisfactory (47.92%).

The morning **Business Site Tours Overall** were rated as **86.95%** Very Satisfied (80.43%) or Satisfied (6.52%). The **Information Provided** at the afternoon session was rated as **90.30%** Very Satisfied (52.08%) or Satisfied (37.50%). With an **Overall Afternoon Conference satisfaction rate of 4.29 on a 5.0 scale.**

Of the respondents, **78.38% of participants would attend additional organized business or school sites** demonstrating workforce development and work-based learning experiences.

Follow-Up Activities

Based on the responses to the surveys, five additional site visits have been arranged. “Coffee and Collaboration” events are intended to start the conversation on how schools can partner with businesses to engage and inspire students about career options and raise awareness about career preparation opportunities.

Coffee and Collaboration events include:

- Visits to our region’s high demand job sectors to witness firsthand the workforce needs and impact of the growing skills gap.
- Visits to our region’s secondary career technical education school districts and Career Technical Planning Districts to see workforce development training programs in action to meet the growing skills gap.
