


Our Vision

TAC Through The Years

1952

Town and Country Day School opened in Springfield

1960-1966

Part of school becomes a vocational training program and is renamed Town and Country Workshop

1983

TAC Industries incorporates as a non-profit organization

2005

TAC and Developmental Disabilities of Clark County separate

2009

TAC removes "developmental" from mission statement to include a broader range of disabilities

2020

Commitment to transforming TAC's service delivery through an innovative and progressive strategic plan. Add "other barriers" to Mission.

TAC By The Numbers

TAC is the largest provider of vocational services, adult day services, and non-medical transportation services for adults with disabilities in Clark County.

The TAC team typically consists of over 150 individuals with disabilities served by nearly 125 employees

- Students are paid minimum wage
- Students build practical and transferable skills, preparing them for transition from school to employment

- The PAES Lab will be located at Clark State College, which provides inclusivity and access to the campus.
